

## **BSN-DNP** Family Nurse Practitioner

The University of the Incarnate Word's post-baccalaureate Doctor of Nursing degree with a concentration in the Family Nurse Practitioner role is a 3 year full time program designed to prepare registered nurses for advanced nursing practice. Courses within the program are offered in blended format with online, on-campus, and clinical experience components. The DNP program provides a foundation for leadership development and for the advanced practice role as a nurse practitioner (NP).

## **Unique Features**

- Completion of a baccalaureate degree in nursing from a CCNE or NLN (CNEA) accredited program which includes courses in statistics and health assessment.
- An undergraduate cumulative GPA of 2.75 or above, with a 3.0 GPA in upper division nursing courses.
- A current unencumbered license to practice nursing in the State of Texas or one of the compact states recognized by the State of Texas.
- Three professional or academic references.
- A minimum of one year of relevant experience in professional nursing is preferred, but not required.
- An in-person interview with UIW graduate faculty will be arranged for qualified individuals.

Application cycle begins every May for a Spring Semester start date.
